Subcontractor Policy

Prior to starting work on Meridian 60 Offshore sites, all subcontractors are required to submit the following items to the responsible manager:

1. Workers Compensation Board (WCB) or Workplace Health, Safety and Compensation Commission (WHSCC) Letter of Good Standing
2. Any requested safety policies.

Subcontractors working at any Meridian 60 Offshore sites shall, prior to starting work, sign in and meet with the responsible manager to complete a “Contractor Orientation”. The subcontractor will also complete KDPF001 – Supplier Evaluation and will return the completed questionnaire with applicable documentation to the responsible Manager who will forward to the HSEQ Manager.

While working on Meridian 60 Offshore projects, subcontractors are required to follow all Meridian 60 Offshore safety rules, procedures and policies as well as report all incidents and/or hazards to the responsible manager. Any violation of these rules, procedures or policies may result in the subcontractor being asked to stop work, leave the premises or possibly the retraction of the subcontractor’s contract.

**NOTE: It is the responsibility of each subcontractor to ensure that all safety policies meet the obligations according to provincial and/or federal legislation.**
